From the Pastor's Desk... Dear Friends of St. Timothy,

After a number of weeks of medical testing and waiting for conclusions, I wanted to let you know that I am scheduled for a heart valve repair/replacement surgery at the beginning of October. I was diagnosed with a mitral valve prolapse ten years ago and it has been monitored ever since.

Although I have felt few symptoms, tests show increased distress as my heart over-compensates for the leaking valve.

The good news is that I will have some of the best cardiac care in the country, as one of the experienced specialists in PA is right here in Harrisburg and will be my surgeon. So that is very reassuring.

I am told that I will be 3-5 days in the hospital with six weeks of recovery following. We have every reason to expect a full recovery, and are praying that God's hand is upon everything leading up to the surgery and the surgery itself. Yet, I admit to having some anxiety, but the Lord is helping me to manage it!

I see each of you as part of God's help to get through this chapter of life and I know that I can count on your kind understanding and prayer support during this season of preparation and recovery. Jennifer and I both see you truly as blessings in our lives.

Paul's words to the Christ followers of Philippi come to mind, "Every time I think of you, I thank God for you. I have joy in my heart every time I ask God to help you. I thank God for the joy we share in telling the good news from the very first day until now." (Phil. 1:3-5)

SMART COMPUTER AND PHONE USE FOR THE SUMMER This is an important reminder to have a safe summer and be aware of the scams targeting seniors!

Computer technology is rapidly advancing, and with it the opportunities to scam our seniors has increased drastically. I have been in the technology industry for decades, have tried to stay up-to-date on my computer security knowledge, and still have fallen for a few well-timed and convincing online scams. My senior relative responded to a basic pop-up request on their computer - "Your computer is infected, call this number to fix it" - that appeared to come from Microsoft, and signed up for a computer monitoring service that did nothing at all... for \$150/month. The scammers are relentless, and they get more sophisticated in their approach every day.

There's plenty of good advice on how to avoid scams - including computer/technology scams - at the FTC website (consumer.ftc.gov) as well as other reliable sources. Google "computer scams on seniors" to find plenty of information that can help you and your relatives spot a scam. However, I found with my senior parents and in-laws that two simple rules helped tremendously:

- 1. For the senior please contact a family member before ever clicking on a "download now," "click to fix," or similar message on your computer, or before you call _any_ number that's provided by _anyone_ asking for you to call. This rule gives you a chance to ask questions to a trusted contact who can help you understand any implications of responding to those requests. It may feel excessive, but it is an easy rule to understand and helped me catch numerous scams with my senior parents before it was too late.
- 2. For the senior please consider giving a trusted relative or friend access to monitor your transactions. Allow someone you trust to monitor your account for things that don't look right—without giving that person the right to access your funds. <u>Older Americans are not alone in the fight to stop financial abuse. (consumerfinance.gov)</u>.
- 3. For the family be sure to frequently ask your senior how their computer is working. Keep an ear out for things like "my computer is running really slow" or "I can't access my email anymore" or "I'm getting all these pop-up windows coming up all the time." Really, anything that indicates that something has changed about how their computer is working. And if you hear one of these trigger phrases, investigate. If possible, check out their computer in person. If they are far away, either talk them through a computer check-up over the phone, or use a reputable screen sharing tool such as TeamViewer to remotely diagnose their system.
- 4. For the family– be alert to a senior who is acting stressed and refuses to share what is causing the stressful situation. Scammers can create 'stressor' around a situation and tells the senior they can't talk to anybody about it. The stressor situation that the scammer creates is often centered around a family member who is in trouble (jail, in another country with no funds) they may even pretend to be that family member. Or the scammer might say they have found something embarrassing about the senior/victim (porn). Either way, scammers can convince seniors they cannot tell other family members about the situation for whatever reason. This obviously gives all power to the scammer to tell the senior what to do without outside interference. Stay attentive to noticing if a senior is acting like they are under stress and they won't tell you the reason.

In this summer season, the scammers are hard-at-work already using new techniques and playing on the emotions of their targets. Watch out for odd requests and computer performance, talk to each other, and keep the summer scam-free.

Last December my trusting, innocent, 84-year-old widowed mom was driving alone into the rough inner city of Pittsburgh to deposit \$20k cash in a cryptocurrency ATM. She had been convinced just enough to believe the U. S. Government mistakenly thought she was a felon and she had to pay a fine to fix the mess. Following the instructions of the scammer, she withdrew money from all her checking accounts in a suburban neighborhood of Pittsburgh. To "protect" her family she refused to share any details about the situation to the concerned bank managers or her family. The money was lost, and thankfully no other identity theft occurred. Although she was very suspicious of the scammer, there were enough partial grains of truths to convince her to act. She learned a very hard lesson not to trust the popup screens on her computer or people claiming to represent Federal agencies. I am glad to share this with you that it might help you learn from someone else's mistakes.

Always be careful opening any email without looking at the address first, and certainly to never click on any links. Also, scammers are starting to send scam text messages along the same lines. Bottom line - It's always better to be safe and call the person or email them from a "new" email asking if they sent you anything. Never reply to or forward the original email.

Be cautious of "odd" emails or texts that seem to be coming from one of your accounts. Banking/investment accounts, checking/savings accounts, social security accounts, pension accounts, doctor/medical appointments, utility companies, or post office. Don't reply, don't forward, don't click on links. Instead, call the place of business and inquire about the "odd" email/text received. Or, call/discuss the "odd' email/text received with a family member.


Red Cart Library


THE PRODIGAL SON

Sunday Worship

From the Bible, here are some great "God is" reasons for wanting to attend worship every Sunday!

- 1) God is Compassionate and Gracious. "The Lord is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in love" (Psalm 103:8)
- 2) God is our Refuge and Help. "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble" (Psalm 46:1)
- 3) **God is with us.** "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand" (Isaiah 41:10)
- 4) God is Forgiving and Merciful. "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9)
- 5) **God is Loving.** "How great is the love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are!" (1 John 3:1)

Shepherding Care thoughts - Spirit- led love!

The early church, especially the Apostle Paul, emphasized the importance of using our freedom to love others. Our freedom from the bondage of sin thanks to our Lord's victory on the cross! Our freedom to love others as we are led by the Holy Spirit!

Consider these verses from Galatians 5:13 – 18:



"13 You, my brothers, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the sinful nature, rather, serve one another in love. 14 The entire law is summed up in a single command: Love your neighbor as yourself". 15 If you keep on biting and devouring each other, watch out or you will be destroyed by each other. 16 So I say, live by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the sinful nature. 17 For the sinful nature desires what is contrary to the Spirit, and the Spirit what is contrary to the sinful nature. They are in conflict with each other, so that you do not do what you want. 18 But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law."

Consider these questions:

- God calls His people to be what? (v. 13a)
- In what way, however, is this freedom limited? (v. 13b)
- For what purpose is God's people made free in Christ? (v.13c)
- What single command sums up the whole Law? (v. 14)
- If this command is not practiced by God's people, what consequence will they experience? (v. 15)
- By Whom, then, ought God's people live? (v. 16a)
- If God's people live by the Spirit, what will be the consequence? (v.16b)
- How do the desires of the sinful nature and those of the Spirit relate to each other? (v. 17)
- When are we not under the Law? (v. 18)

Each and every day, may you freely enjoy loving others as you prayerfully seek the Spirit to guide your ways!

FANTASTIC, WOW, WAY TO GO



Words can't express what a great job our congregation did this year in supporting the 2024 Fill the Ark Project during Lent. We raised a total of \$1,800. All the monies were sent to Heifer International. This year our donation was doubled – thus DOUBLING THE IMPACT OF OUR GIFT. This year the following animals have been purchased with the money received. The selection

included a Heifer (\$500), a Water Buffalo (\$250), two Alpacas/Llamas (\$300), two Goats (\$240), two Pigs (\$240), one trio of Rabbits (\$60), one Flock of Ducks (\$20), one Flock of Chickens (\$20), Honeybees (\$60) and Garden Seeds (\$70).

On-line Giving



Earlier this year, St Timothy partnered with a new church management software company to replace a very dated application with current technology. The new software, One Church, provides among other things, the capability for persons to make on-line donations to support the ministries of St Timothy. Donations to St Timothy can be made via ACH (automatic clearing house)

transfers directly from a donor's checking or savings account, or by debit or

credit card. Donations can be set up on a single transaction basis, or as a series of recurring transactions on a schedule that suits the donor. Mobile phones will also be able to access the giving portal. Donors will have the option to include in their gifts the transaction fees associated with ACH and credit card transactions.

Security and privacy are assured by the same methods and techniques used by banks and other institutions to encrypt and safeguard electronic financial transactions.

On-line giving will become active as of July 1, 2024, at the start of the new fiscal year at St Timothy. The giving portal as well as Instructions on how to access the giving portal to set up electronic donations will be provided through links in e-blasts and also on the St. Timothy website (<u>www.sttim.com</u>). Paper copies of the instructions will be available on request from the church office.
