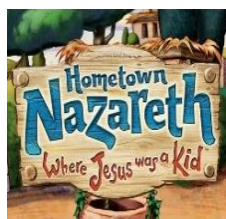

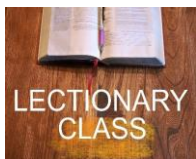

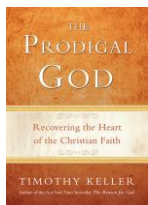

Lectionary Class



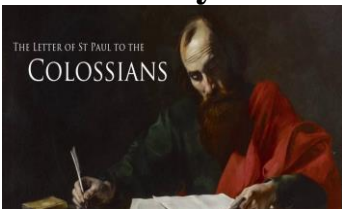
Join this class, led by Jason Swartley, as they delve deeper into the Old Testament, Psalm, New Testament, and Gospel readings appointed for each Sunday.

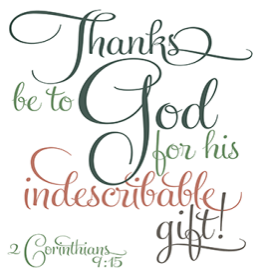

“**Thanks be to God** for His indescribable gift!” (2 Corinthians 9:15)



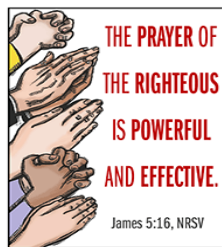
Shepherding Care thoughts...treasure chests!
